We are excited to tell you about some enhancements to your Medicare benefits that may lower your Part B costs because of the Inflation Reduction Act. Below you will find a review of the changes to your plan. These enhancements will apply to all Medicare Advantage plans, including ours.

Important Message About What You Pay for Part B Prescription Drugs – Starting April 1, 2023, the coinsurance you pay for Part B drugs may be **less** than what is outlined in your Evidence of Coverage. Due to the Inflation Reduction Act, this amount may vary depending on the drug and time of fill but will **never** exceed the coinsurance outlined in your EOC.

Important Message About What You Pay for Part B Insulin Products – Starting July 1, 2023, you will pay **no more than** \$35 for a one-month supply of insulins covered by our plan, furnished under Part B, such as insulin administered via pump. Note that this \$35 limit only applies to the insulin itself and not to the pump.

You do not need to take any action. You will automatically receive these updated benefits on the dates stated above.
